- Practice an hour or so a week (15 minute intervals)
- If you feel that you have pretty much mastered these skills, please feel free to go onto 4th grade examples.

Language Arts:

You are welcomed to work on any 3rd grade IXL Language skills. This is optional, but great practice for language skills (capitalization, punctuation, sentences structure, syntax...)

Reading:

Please read at least **two** books over the summer.
